

Bay Estuary Classroom Presentations

KIDS for the BAY will bring the San Francisco Bay Estuary into your classroom with hands-on science experiments, investigations of animals and plants and activities that explore important environmental health issues. Each program includes three hours of instruction and a teacher's activity package.



BAY ESTUARY SCIENTISTS (GRADES 2–6)

- Investigate animals and plants that live in the Bay, including fish, crabs, and seaweed, and make Bay food chains.
- Create a three dimensional Bay Estuary environment.
- Experiment with mixing fresh water and salt water to discover the unique properties of an estuary.
- Find your place in the San Francisco Bay Area, using large, full color maps.
- Learn how to help preserve and restore the Bay.

SAFE BAY FISHING AND COOKING (GRADES 4–6)

Eating polluted Bay fish can cause health problems. This program teaches safe fishing and cooking practices that reduce health risks.

- Investigate Bay animals and plants and connect them into food chains.
- Play games that illustrate the biomagnification of pollutants in Bay food chains.
- Learn about health risks associated with eating Bay food.
- Observe a Safe Bay Fish Cooking Demonstration and learn safety guidelines.

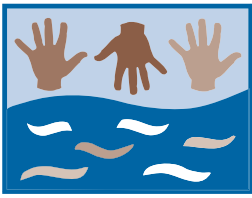
