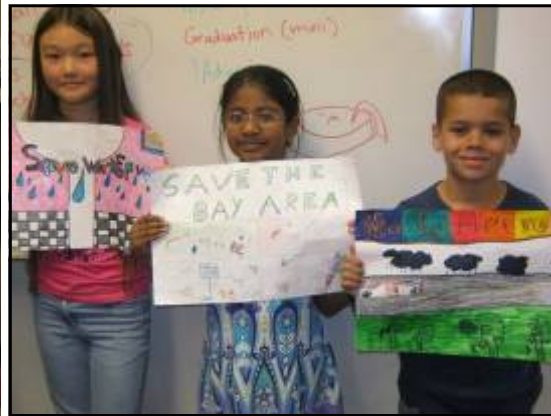




STORM DRAIN RANGERS PROGRAM

2010-2011 Year in Review



In 2010-2011...

- ◆ The Storm Drain Rangers Program empowered over 400 students to take action to prevent pollution in their communities
- ◆ Families in fifteen classes have analyzed their water usage and learned ways to conserve water
- ◆ A fourth grade student from Acorn Woodland Elementary in Oakland organized her own community clean-up over Memorial Day weekend with several neighborhood families
- ◆ 90 students in Fremont made pledges to pick up any litter they see on the street and to make sure garbage does not go down the storm drain
- ◆ Six schools committed to make storm water pollution prevention a component of their educational programs

Rangers: members of a troop in charge of patrolling a specific region
